

Since 2004, Dynamar has been publishing reports on specific container liner trades. Having evolved from single shipping-lane studies, they now cover *all* direct trade lanes connecting with one region, as in here, the composite East Africa, Southern Africa and Indian Ocean Islands trade, ESAf for short. In essence, these off-the-shelf consultancy studies provide an in-depth survey through:

- An assessment of the size of the trade (full container carryings, trade capacity, port throughputs)
- A competition inventory (carriers, vessels, services, capacity analyses)
- The container trade in context (commodities/cargoes, merchandise trade volumes, economies)

This publication is the sixth for ESAf building upon the earlier successful editions that have been issued biennially since 2011. This current edition still follows the same format as our other trade lane studies, covering the following key areas:

- An Executive Summary of key themes, figures, conclusions and forecasts
- An Introduction defining the region and some of its characteristics
- Major carrier developments and ESAf trade related profiles of those currently deploying vessels
- Summaries of all direct liner trades connecting ESAf, covering:

 - In ESAf and, NEW, a summary of port patronage by carrier and Annual Trade Capacity

- Ports and terminals:
 - Summarised port/ terminal developments
 - Throughputs for major ESAf ports called
 - Profiles of the major global/regional and private container terminal operators in ESAf
